Course Description

This 15-contact hour comprehensive course is designed to prepare students for success on the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS), a standardized exam required for admission to many nursing and allied health programs. The course focuses on the four primary content areas assessed on the TEAS exam:

- **Reading:** Develop critical reading skills, comprehension strategies, and techniques for understanding passages and answering related questions efficiently.
- **Mathematics:** Strengthen foundational math skills, including arithmetic, algebra, measurement, and data interpretation.
- **Science:** Explore core concepts in life science, chemistry, anatomy and physiology, and scientific reasoning to enhance problem-solving skills.
- **English and Language Usage:** Improve grammar, punctuation, sentence structure, and vocabulary for clear and accurate communication.

Students will benefit from practice tests, personalized feedback, and targeted study strategies to increase confidence and test readiness. By the end of the course, participants will be equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to excel on the TEAS exam and advance toward their healthcare career goals.
