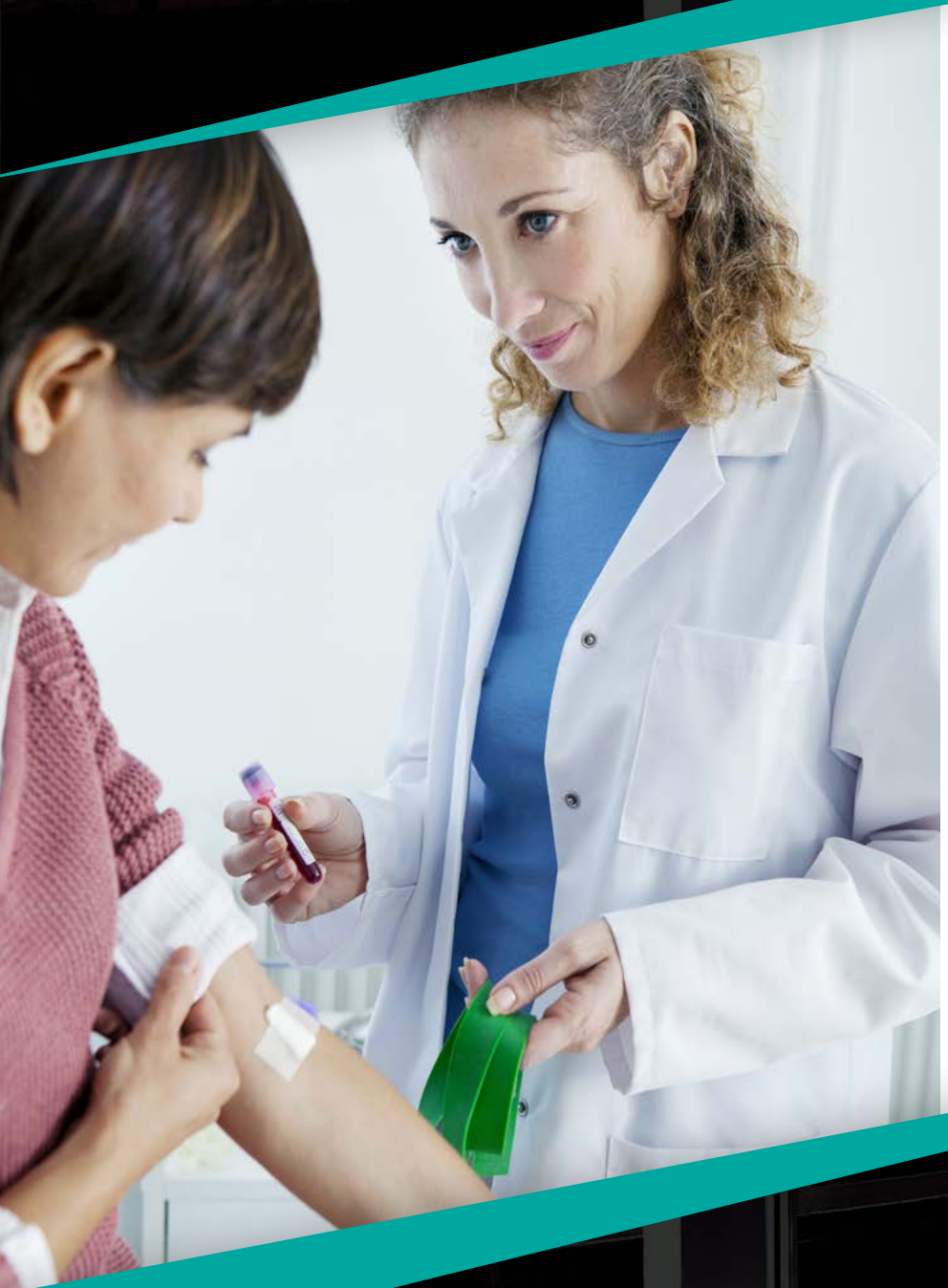

PHLEBOTOMY

ADVANCED SKILL SET

Phlebotomists are skilled health care professionals who have been trained to collect, transport, handle and process blood and other specimens for laboratory analysis using venipuncture and microcollection techniques. In addition, phlebotomists must be able to identify and select equipment, supplies and additives used in blood collection and understand factors that affect specimen collection procedures and test results.

The Phlebotomy program at Pierpont prepares students for immediate employment in the health care field, and for current health care workers who would like to expand their skill sets.

Many students elect to expand their employment opportunities by completing the Phlebotomy and Laboratory Assistant programs concurrently.

Skill Sets and Advanced Skill Sets, including Phlebotomy, are not eligible for Financial Aid. Students seeking financial aid should consider completing the Laboratory Assistant program - which includes the Phlebotomy Advanced Skill Set.

SALARY RANGE

The median annual salary for Phlebotomists is over \$29,000.
